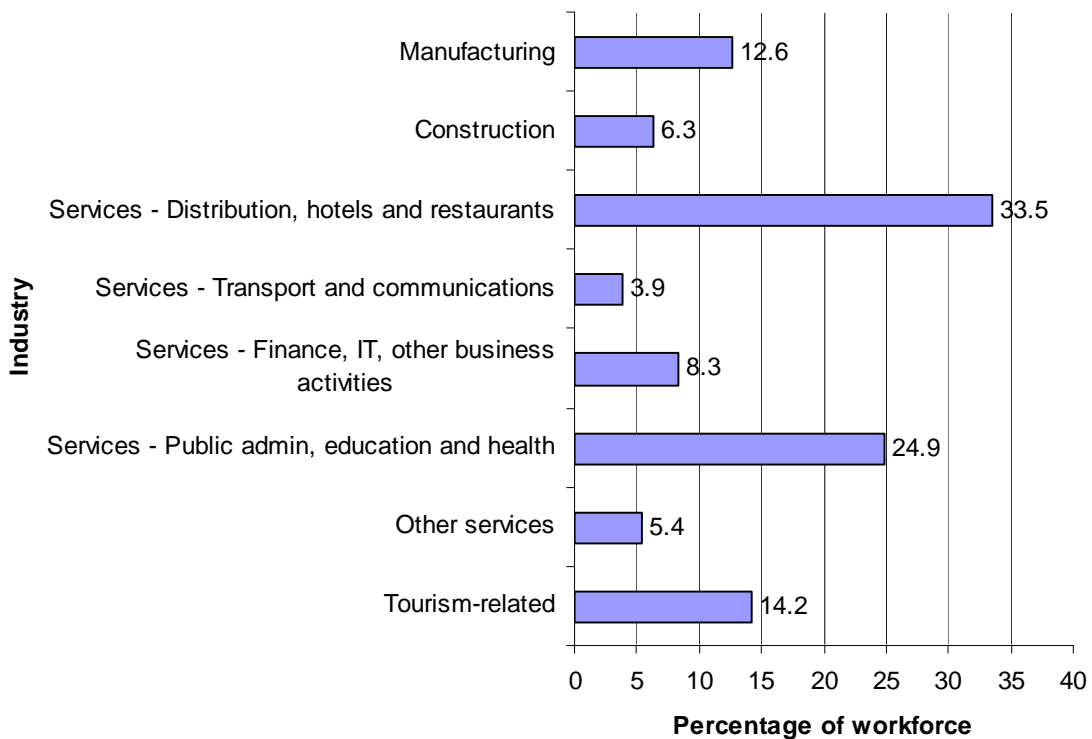


Labour market information for North Cornwall

How many people live and work in North Cornwall?

The ONS Annual Population Survey (2009) recorded 87,200 people living in North Cornwall, mostly in the main towns of Bodmin, Bude, Camelford and Launceston. 40,600 people were in employment.

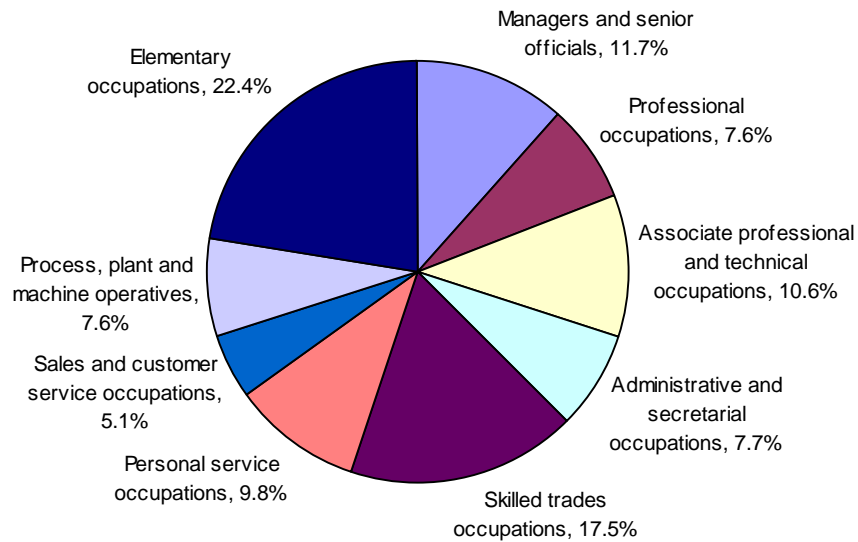
What industries do people work in?



The largest sector of employment in North Cornwall is distribution, hotels and restaurants, which employs 33.5% of the working population. The smallest sector is transport and communications at 3.9%.

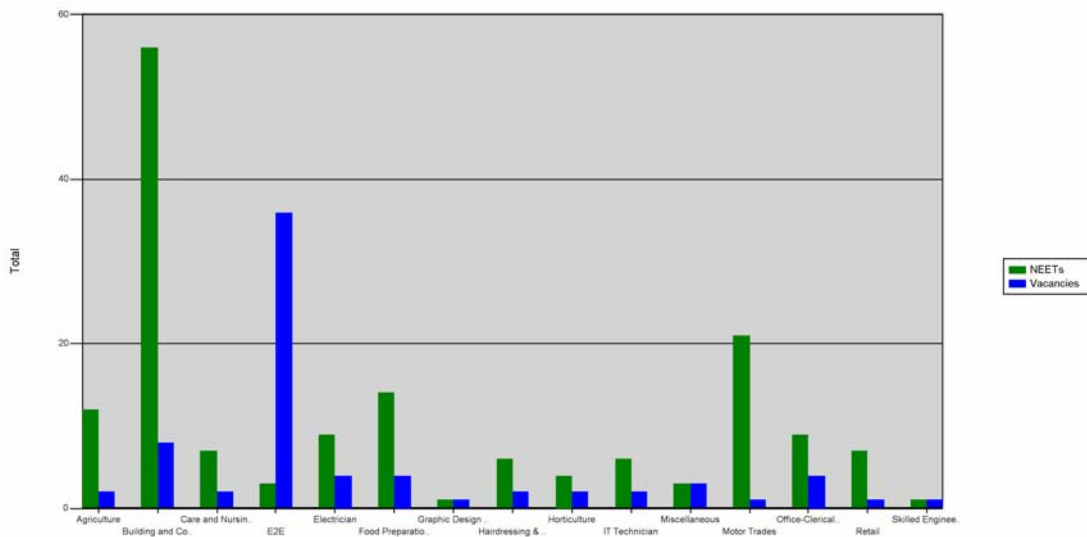
